Bay of Fires Sparkling Cuvee, TAS	12	50
– It doesn't get any better than this for Australian sparkling wine. Great winery, great flavours (white peach & honey) and great price = celebrate!

– They make bubbles in regions other than Champagne you know, and this little gem is from a winery established in 1550, so they must have it right by now. Think butter croissants.

– Rather than give you one from the big name corporates and pay their marketing bill, we prefer to give you one from an actual grower. Delicate bubbles and lots of cream - finesse in a glass.

Bress Rosé 2010, Harcourt Valley VIC	9	36
– Adam Marks went to France to learn how to breed the famous Bresse chicken in Australia and also figured out how to make a cracking Provence-style (light & dry) rosé along the way. Strawberries & cream.		
<i>White</i>		
Ad Hoc Wall Flower Riesling 2010, Mt Barker WA	9	32
– Everything that's good about W.A. wine is in this bottle. It's clean & crisp with a soft floral finish. Outstanding value from one of the best winemakers in the world.		
Dandelion Vineyards, Wonderland of the Eden Valley Riesling 2010 SA		39
– If you want to drink a trendy wine, then pick a good one and drink this. Bursting with fresh citrus flavours and balanced with a hint of minerality.		
Skipjack Sauvignon Blanc 2009, Marlborough NZ	9	32
– The world of NZ sav blanc is a minefield so we have crossed that field for you to deliver, many headaches later, one that conveys what it's supposed to taste like – dry and fruity without the acid overload.		
Craggy Range Old Renwick Sauvignon Blanc 2010, Marlborough NZ		50
– Put up the best Sancerre you can find and this wine will beat it every time. Beautiful flavours of gooseberry & sweet herbs with a long finish – class all the way.		

Cape Mentelle Sauvignon Blanc Semillon 2010, Margaret River WA	11	45
– There is no better Margaret River wine at the price. Quality vineyard produces a stylish wine with perfectly balanced passionfruit & lime flavours. So easy!		
Andrew Thomas The O.C. Semillon 2010, Hunter Valley NSW		38
– How fantastic to have a true wine genius in our own back yard. This guy excels at semillon and this is a refreshingly different wine. Crunchy apples with a hint of biscuit.		
Minnie & Elsa Pinot Grigio 2010, Te Aro Estate Barossa Valley SA	9	33
– The wine pays tribute to the vineyard family matriarchs, Minnie Fromm & Elsa Hausler, and it does them proud. It's light and crisp, even the driver should have a glass.		
Mezzacorona Pinot Grigio Riserva 2008, Trentino ITALY		49
– A reserve pinot grigio from the foot of the Italian Alps, it's an aromatic and full-bodied wine tasting just like that holiday you keep talking about.		
Spinning Top String Range Pinot Gris 2010, Marlborough NZ	9	32
– When you can choose grapes from 3 of the best parcels of land in Marlborough you can't fail to deliver an excellent wine and this Pinot Gris is full of flavour from start to finish. Will make lunch taste better! Honeydew melon.		
Wairau River Pinot Gris 2009, Marlborough NZ		42
– Pinot gris normally delivers a slightly richer, more floral wine than grigio and this one will have the wine buffs salivating. Honeycomb.		
Lusco Do Mino Zios Albarino, Rias Baxias 2008 SPAIN		58
– The albarino grape variety is currently hotter than Cruz/Bardem and this wine really is a beauty. Flavours of rich, ripe fruit with a clean finish.		
Ad Hoc Hen & Chicken Chardonnay 2009, Margaret River WA	9	34
– Another sensational wine from Larry Cherubino. An oaked chardonnay with flavours of melon & stone fruits and a creamy finish. Yum!		
Cloudy Bay Chardonnay 2007, Marlborough NZ		70
– Quality and consistency are why we recognize this winery as one of the best on the planet. Citrus, herbs, tropical fruit - it's all going on here. An exceptional wine.		
Simmonet-Febvre Chablis 2008, FRANCE		65
– Let's face it, a nice chablis for lunch puts everyone in a good mood. From a top producer this is an elegant wine full of flavour (apples & pears). How civilized!

Windflower Pinot Noir 2008, Central Otago NZ	9	36
– The fickle nature of the grape variety means it's hard to get value but we found it in this one (red berry fruits & herbs). The perfect light red for lunch.		
Stonier Pinot Noir 2009, Mornington Peninsula VIC	11	45
– From the perfect place to grow pinot we give you a bottle you will be unwilling to put down. Delicious!! Strawberry & liquorice.		
Saint Clair Pioneer Block 16 Awatere Pinot Noir 2008, Marlborough NZ		58
– When the staff are given a bottle to take home they all choose this one, and why not. It's a stunning example of NZ pinot at its best, full-bodied yet elegant - dark berries with a touch of spice.		
Allegrini Valpolicella Classico DOC 2008, ITALY		48
– If you're a pinot-lover willing to branch out then you could do worse than try this beautiful Valpolicella ('valley of many cellars') from north of Verona, made by top-notch producers in the Allegrini family. Vibrant fresh fruit flavours, it's a wine that gets better with every sip.		
Bodegas Exopto Rioja 2008, SPAIN		40
– An exceptional drop from Tempranillo vines that are almost 100 years old, we are loving this Rioja from a small artisan producer – a real find at an amazing price. Medium-bodied and packed with wonderful flavours that will keep you smiling.		
Domaine Bernard Baudry Les Granges Chinon 2009, FRANCE		48
– A nice light red packed with flavour. Chinon is a village in the Loire valley and a wine made from the cabernet franc grape. Aromatic raspberry & tobacco, an old-school wine the locals would drink over there.		
Estella Cabernet Sauvignon 2008, McLaren Vale SA	9	34
– The founders of this winery have named this wine after their grandmother so it better be good. It's full and juicy with hints of vanilla oak, and a credit to the great wine region of McLaren Vale.		
Eden Springs Cabernet Sauvignon 2005, Eden Valley SA		40
– This is a premium single-vineyard Cabernet drinking at its peak, a real find at an amazing price. It's a rich and intense wine with dark fruit flavours and chocolate overtones – small production at its very best.		
Chalk Hill Barbera 2008, McLaren Vale SA	12	45
– This little family vineyard sent this wine to Italy, the home of the barbera grape, and in a blind tasting against the best in the world, beat them all bar one! But don't tell anyone.		

Masciarelli Montepulciano 2007, d'Abruzzo ITALY			49
– A very cosy Tuscan sangiovese red from the very beautiful Montepulciano, this wine is obviously made with love. Lots of fruit up front but really opens up after the first glass - black pepper & cassia.			
Greenstone Sangiovese Rosso di Colbo 2008, Heathcote VIC			50
– Inspired by Montalcino, the home of “Brunello”, this incredibly elegant wine meets the highest expectations of what an Italian sangiovese should taste like. Totally amazing then that it’s made right here in Australia. Flavours of red cherry & wild herbs, delicious with anything, a real beauty.			
Bannockburn ‘Douglas’ Cabernet Shiraz Merlot 2006, Geelong VIC			50
– This winery consistently delivers top class wine from the volcanic soils of Geelong. Meant to be Italian in style, it’s a lot smoother than your average Italian (if that’s possible). A real pleasure to drink.			
Craggy Range “Gimblett Gravels” Merlot 2009, Hawke’s Bay NZ			56
– Thank god no one drinks merlot anymore - it means we can put a stunning wine like this on our list. Great structure and depth of flavour. Dark cherries & cocoa.			
Chris Ringland CR Ebenezer Shiraz 2008, Barossa Valley SA	10		40
– Probably the best value wine in Australia, taste it with your eyes closed you would think it’s three times the price. Full-bodied but smooth as silk. Chocolate & blueberries.			
Milhinch “Seize The Day” Single Vineyard Shiraz 2007, Barossa Valley SA			55
– If you wanted to showcase the best of Australian shiraz to an overseas visitor, then this would be the wine. Made with TLC by a small producer, it’s full-bodied and basket-pressed for a smooth, dark chocolate finish. Nice name too.			
Guigal Côtes-du-Rhône 2006, FRANCE			44
– There is a subtleness to a French Côtes-du-Rhône that we don’t get with our full-on Aussie shiraz and it’s a pleasant change for those who want a full-bodied wine that’s aromatic and smooth. Smoke & spices.			
John Duval Plexus Shiraz Grenache Mouvedre 2007, Barossa Valley SA			60
– This guy made Penfolds Grange for 20 years so he knows what he’s talking about, and he delivers with this beautifully complex blend that reveals incredibly diverse flavours of spice, pepper, & blackberry.
